

Adams County, commonly referred to as "apple country," is known for its ideal topography for growing tree fruits. The Rice Family has been growing apples since the 1790's and Rice Fruit Company was founded in 1913. Over the last 100+ years, Rice Fruit has expanded its operation to include fruit packing for over 40 local fruit growers. They supply fruit trees and orchard supplies to commercial growers in the multiple growing regions and also operate 200+ acres of apple and peach orchard. Fun Facts About Virginia Apples

- Warm days, cool nights and a rich, deep soil nurtured by consistent rainfall makes Virginia's climate ideal for growing many apple varieties.
- Virginia's apple harvest begins in July and extends through early November.
- An average of 5 million to 6 million bushels of apples are produced annually by Virginia growers. American growers produce over 235 million bushels annually.
- Virginia apple growers produce many popular varieties including Red Delicious, Golden Delicious, Rome, Stayman, Gala, Winesap, York, Granny Smith, Jonathan, Fuji and Ginger Gold.
- Virginia apple country includes the mountainous region of the northern Shenandoah Valley through the Roanoke Valley, the rich countryside of Albermarle and Rappahannock counties and the southwest counties of Patrick and Carroll. The majority of apples trees are grown in the Shenandoah Valley.
- Virginia apple varieties require 90 to 175 growing days from spring bloom to fall harvest.

- With the use of Controlled Atmosphere Storage, or CA, apples are placed in airtight warehouses where the climate is maintained to delay further ripening.
- From 1992 to 1997 over 1,880,000 new apple trees were planted in Virginia orchards.
- Depending on the type of root stock, 100 to 500 apple trees are planted to the acre
- In Virginia, the estimated commercial apple yield per acre is 700 bushels.
- Seventy percent of Virginia apples are sold for processing and made into popular products such as applesauce, apple juice, apple butter, slices and cider.
- Virginia apples are destined for markets in 15 states and more than 20 countries.
- The Virginia apple industry contributes an estimated \$235 million annually to the state's economy.
